## WHAT PET OWNERS NEED TO KNOW

The University of Florida has **confirmed over one dozen cases** of canine influenza virus A (H3N2 CIV) in North Florida since the end of May 2017.

H3N2 CIV is a virus that causes respiratory symptoms in dogs, including:

Sneezing  
Nasal Discharge  
Frequent Coughing  
Fever  
Decreased Appetite  
Lethargy

We will be offering **A COMPLIMENTARY OFFICE VISIT** for patients wanting to update their vaccine status to include our bivalent canine flu vaccine (covering both the H3N2 *and* H3N8 canine flu viruses) through June 16, 2017.
